

# LATEX PAINT

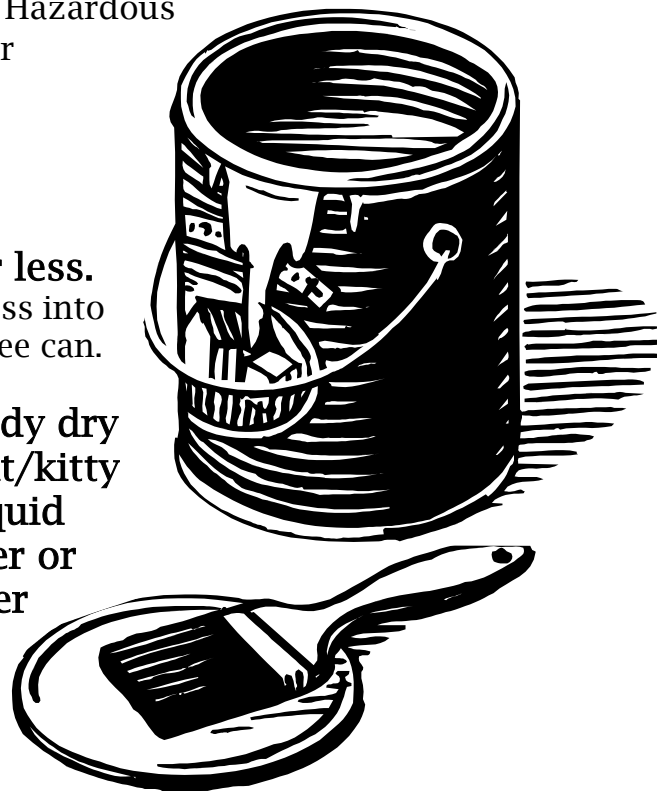


## Clean Communities

**Latex** paint (also called water-based) is NOT a Hazardous waste. It can be disposed of with the rest of your household waste. Just follow the proper instructions listed below.

### How to properly dispose of latex paint:

- Make sure the paint can is  $\frac{1}{2}$  full or less. If the can is more than  $\frac{1}{2}$ -full, pour excess into another container, like a milk jug or coffee can.
- Add clay-based kitty litter or speedy dry so that the can is  $\frac{3}{4}$ -full. Stir paint/kitty litter or speedy dry mixture. If liquid paint remains, add more kitty litter or speedy dry. Allow paint/kitty litter or speedy dry mixture to become so thick that it can no longer be poured. Put in trash bag and discard with your other trash.
