WILLOW OAK TRAILS DEDICATED TO MARY TREAT



Vineland's rich history is gaining a new chapter with the dedication of the Willow Oak Natural Area trail system to Mary Treat, a pioneering ecologist and one of Vineland's most influential historical residents. The Vineland Environmental Commission made the recommendation to City Council following requests from both the Vineland Historical Society and Citizens United to Protect the Maurice River. A Council resolution was passed

in November, and a special dedication ceremony is being planned for the Spring of 2026.

Her connection to Vineland dates back to the late 19th century when she conducted groundbreaking botanical research in our community. Her work not only advanced local understanding of the natural world but also contributed to broader scientific discoveries, making her a source of pride for residents and historians alike.

Mary's legacy also extends far beyond Vineland. She is renowned for her correspondence with Charles Darwin, sharing insights and findings that influenced the course of evolutionary biology. She discovered several new plant and insect species and authored multiple scientific books. Her achievements have been immortalized in literature with novelist Barbara Kingsolver highlighting Treat's life and work in her acclaimed novel "Unsheltered."

"Mary Treat's contributions to science and Vineland are a testament to the power of curiosity and perseverance," Mayor Fanucci said. "Dedicating the Willow Oak trail system in her honor is a meaningful way for the Vineland community to remember and celebrate her life's work."
